The Eastern & Oriental Express cabin interior walls are cherry wood and elm burr paneled, adorned with decorative marquetry and intricate inlays.

Each cabin is fully air-conditioned with an en suite shower, washbasin and WC and features large picture windows for an excellent view of the passing scenery. Facilities include 24-hour steward service, international electric sockets (220 volts) and 110 volt adapter for razors, a personal safe and hairdryer.



Penang is a destination that embraces modernity while retaining its traditions and old world charm. These are reflected in its harmonious multiracial populace and well-preserved heritage buildings which led to George Town being accorded a listing as a UNESCO World Cultural Heritage Site recently.

## Penang 1/2 Day itinerary
